# Please note this letter from the President, Executive, and Delegates to the Alberta Music Festival Association (AMFA)

October 22, 2018

President AMFA

Dear AMFA Members and Festival Participants,

It is with some sadness that I have to report that, at the 2018 AMFA Annual General Meeting (AGM), **Alberta voted to leave the Federation of Canadian Music Festivals (FCMF) immediately**. The vote was unanimous with one abstention. Each year, it costs our Festivals about \$40,000 to send participants and delegates to the National Festival. There are usually 6-10 participants and 4 delegates who attend.

As you recognize this is a lot of money; and, it is money from your Local Festivals and participants. Over the past two years, the FCMF has displayed a significant lack of fiscal responsibility, questionable governance, and has clearly shown a lack of transparency. We felt it best to leave. Although we have tried, we don't seem to be able to change things.

The week before our AGM, British Columbia voted to leave as well, and for the same reasons.

The result of this is that there are no longer any Provincial National Classes in Alberta. However, in their place for this year, we have instituted **ALBERTA EXCELLENCE CLASSES** in Voice, Piano, Guitar, Musical Theatre, Percussion, Strings, Brass, Woodwinds, Chamber Music, **AND** Speech. Speech was never a part of the FCMF, and we are very happy to add it. Each Alberta Festival can have one person in each class, and the prize for each **ALBERTA EXCELLENCE CLASS** is \$1,000.00. These competitions will take place at the Alberta Provincial Music Festival — the criteria for each class are outlined under **ALBERTA EXCELLENCE CLASSES** in the **PROVINCIAL SYLLABUS**.

Choirs will also have **ALBERTA EXCELLENCE CLASSES** that reflect the same classes that were in the National Syllabus (i.e. 19 & Under). The criteria for those classes remain the same as in the past. These will continue to be recorded competitions, at least for this year. The prize for each **ALBERTA EXCELLENCE CHOIR CLASS** is \$1,000.00.

Following this Festival, we hope to be able to join with BC and any other province who has chosen to leave FCMF and form either a Western Festival, or a new Canadian Festival.

This was a hard decision to make, but we felt that the money currently being sent to the FCMF could be better used to support our young artists and choirs in Alberta.

# Appendix IV: Alberta Excellence Classes

## REQUIREMENTS FOR ALBERTA EXCELLENCE CLASSES

Please contact your Local Festival for details **before** entering any Alberta Excellence Class.

### **ALBERTA EXCELLENCE VOCAL SOLO, Any Voice**

#### ALL SELECTIONS MUST BE MEMORIZED AT ALL LEVELS (LOCAL & PROVINCIAL)

#### Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum

- 1. In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:
  - **Enter Class 93000 and perform the following repertoire:** 
    - One (1) advanced selection from an Opera, with recitative where applicable, original key, original
    - One (1) advanced Sacred Aria (Aria from an Oratorio, a work of J.S. Bach, or other major sacred work), with recitative where applicable, original key, language optional.
    - One (1) advanced Canadian Art Song or arranged Canadian Folk Song.
- 2. Enter at least two (2) other Minimum Associate Standard classes or a specified class in your Local Festival addendum so that will have sufficient repertoire should you be recommended to the Provincial Festival.

#### **Provincial Festival**

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes inclusive.

English plus two (2) or more languages to be used.

Competitors must perform **five (5) selections** consisting of:

- 1. One (1) selection from an Opera, with recitative where applicable; from advanced repertoire, original key, original language as recommended from the Local Festival.
- 2. One (1) Sacred Aria (Aria from an Oratorio, a work of J.S. Bach, or other major sacred work), with recitative where applicable, as recommended from the Local Festival.
- 3. One (1) advanced Canadian Art Song or arranged Canadian Folk Song as recommended from the Local Festival.
- Own choice selection from advanced repertoire performed at the Local Festival.
   Own choice selection from advanced repertoire performed at the Local Festival.

Please contact your Local Festival for details **before** entering any Alberta Excellence Class.

#### ALBERTA EXCELLENCE PIANO SOLO

#### ALL SELECTIONS MUST BE MEMORIZED AT ALL LEVELS (LOCAL & PROVINCIAL)

#### Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum.

In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:

- 1. Enter Class 70000 and perform the following repertoire:
  - Perform one (1) own choice selection from an advanced Sonata, Concerto, or a complete Concerted Work
- 2. Enter at least one (1) other Minimum Associate Standard class or a specified in your local Festival addendum so that you will have sufficient repertoire should you be recommended to the Provincial Festival.

#### Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit: 60 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform two (2) selections consisting of:

- 1. Complete advanced Sonata, Concerto, or Concerted Work as recommended from the Local Festival;
- Own choice selection from advanced repertoire performed at the Local Festival (may not be another Concerto). If this selection is from a multi-movement work, additional movements or the complete work may be performed depending on time.

#### ALBERTA EXCELLENCE STRING SOLO

Instrument must be stated on entry form.

#### ALL SELECTIONS MUST BE MEMORIZED AT ALL LEVELS (LOCAL & PROVINCIAL)

#### Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum.

In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:

- 1. Enter Class 30000 and perform the following repertoire:
  - Perform one (1) own choice selection from an advanced Concerto, or a complete Concerted Work.
- 2. Enter at least one (1) other Minimum Associate Standard class or as specified in your local Festival addendum so that you will have sufficient repertoire should you be recommended to the Provincial Festival.

#### Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit: 60 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform two (2) selections consisting of:

- 1. Complete advanced Concerto or Concerted Work as recommended from the Local Festival;
- Own choice selection from advanced repertoire performed at the Local Festival (may not be another Concerto). If
  this selection is from a multi-movement work, additional movements or the complete work may be performed
  depending on time.

Please contact your Local Festival for details **before** entering any Alberta Excellence Class.

#### ALBERTA EXCELLENCE CLASSICAL GUITAR SOLO

#### ALL SELECTIONS MUST BE MEMORIZED AT ALL LEVELS (LOCAL & PROVINCIAL)

#### Local Festival

Piano accompaniment is permitted, where appropriate.

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum.

In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:

- 1. Enter Class 39000 and perform the following repertoire:
  - Perform one (1) own choice selection from a senior or advanced multi-movement work
  - Perform one (1) own choice selection from a senior or advanced work (may not be another Concerto or another movement from the above).
- 2. Enter at least one (1) other Minimum Associate Standard classes or a specified in your local Festival addendum so that you will have sufficient repertoire should you be recommended to the Provincial Festival.

#### **Provincial Festival**

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform three (3) selections from advanced repertoire consisting of:

- 1. Two (2) complete own choice selections as recommended from the Local Festival.
- 2. One (1) own choice selection **performed at the Local Festival** (may not be another Concerto or another movement from the above).

#### ALBERTA EXCELLENCE WOODWIND SOLO

Instrument must be stated on the entry form.

#### ALL SELECTIONS MUST BE MEMORIZED AT ALL LEVELS (LOCAL & PROVINCIAL)

#### Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:

- 1. Enter Class 40000 and perform the following repertoire:
  - Perform **one (1) own choice selection** from an advanced Concerto, or a complete Concerted Work.
- 2. Enter at least one (1) other Minimum Associate Standard class or a specified in your local Festival addendum so that you will have sufficient repertoire should you be recommended to the Provincial Festival.

#### Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit: 60 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform two (2) selections from advanced repertoire consisting of:

- 1. Complete advanced Concerto or Concerted Work as recommended from the Local Festival;
- 2. Own choice selection **performed at the Local Festival** (may not be another Concerto). If this selection is from a multi-movement work, additional movements or the complete work may be performed depending on time.

Please contact your Local Festival for details **before** entering any Alberta Excellence Class.

#### ALBERTA EXCELLENCE BRASS SOLO

Instrument must be stated on entry form.

#### ALL SELECTIONS MUST BE MEMORIZED AT ALL LEVELS (LOCAL & PROVINCIAL)

#### Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum.

In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:

- 1. Enter Class 50000 and perform the following repertoire:
  - Perform **one (1) own choice selection** from an advanced Concerto, or a complete Concerted Work.
- 2. Enter at least one (1) other Minimum Associate Standard class or a specified in your local Festival addendum so that you will have sufficient repertoire should you be recommended to the Provincial Festival.

#### Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit: 60 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform **two (2) selections from advanced repertoire** consisting of:

- 1. Complete advanced Concerto or Concerted Work as recommended from the Local Festival;
- 2. Own choice selection **performed at the Local Festival** (may not be another Concerto). If this selection is from a multi-movement work, additional movements or the complete work may be performed depending on time.

#### ALBERTA EXCELLENCE CHAMBER GROUP

Voice category and/or instruments must be stated on entry form.

A combination of any recognized orchestral instruments including harp, guitar, recorder and/or percussion with or without piano and/or one voice, with a minimum of 3 to a maximum of 6 performers, each having their own part. When piano is included, the piano part must be original and not an orchestral reduction. Instrumentation and amplification may be used only as indicated in the original score.

#### Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum.

In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:

- 1. Enter Class 17000 and perform the following repertoire:
  - At least two (2) consecutive movements of an advanced work;
  - One (1) own choice selection from advanced repertoire (may not be another movement of the above).
- 2. Additional classes may be entered at the Local Level.

#### **Provincial Festival**

Maximum time limit of 60 minutes including set up, tuning, pauses, and striking (removal of equipment). Competitors must perform **two (2) selections** consisting of:

- 1. Complete own choice selection from advanced repertoire as recommended from the Local Level;
- 2. Own choice selection from advanced repertoire **as recommended from the Local Festival.** If this selection is from a multi-movement work, additional movements or the complete work may be performed depending on time.

Please contact your Local Festival for details **before** entering any Alberta Excellence Class.

#### ALBERTA EXCELLENCE PERCUSSION SOLO

#### **MEMORIZATION AS STATED**

Instruments must be stated on the entry form. Piano accompaniment is permitted, where appropriate. All works for single percussion instruments **MUST** be **MEMORIZED**. For multi-instrument works and snare drum, **MEMORIZIATION** is encouraged, but **NOT REQUIRED**.

#### Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum

In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:

- 1. Enter Class 60001 and perform the following repertoire:
  - One (1) work for Keyboard Percussion (e.g. marimba, vibraphone, xylophone) from advanced repertoire
  - One (1) work for Timpani OR Multi-percussion OR Snare Drum from advanced repertoire
  - One (1) own choice from advanced repertoire
- 2. At the discretion of the Local Festival, the competitor may perform live **OR** via recording.

#### Provincial Festival (Live Competition)

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform the same three (3) selections as recommended from the Local Level consisting of:

- 1. One (1) work for Keyboard Percussion (e.g. marimba, vibraphone, xylophone) from advanced repertoire;
- 2. One (1) work for Timpani **OR** Multi-percussion **OR** Snare Drum from advanced repertoire;
- 3. One (1) own choice from advanced repertoire.

#### \*\*NEW IN 2019\*\* ALBERTA EXCELLENCE SPEECH SOLO

#### ALL SELECTIONS MUST BE MEMORIZED AT ALL LEVELS (LOCAL & PROVINCIAL)

#### Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 20 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum

- 1. In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:
  - Enter Class 80000 and perform the following repertoire:
    - One (1) Solo Scene any period.
    - One (1) Lyric Poetry Solo.
    - One (1) Narrative Dramatic or excerpt from Prose Reading.
- 2. Enter at least two (2) other Minimum Associate Standard classes or a specified class in your Local Festival addendum so that will have sufficient repertoire should you be recommended to the Provincial Festival.

#### **Provincial Festival**

Time Limit: Maximum of 30 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform five (5) selections consisting of:

- One (1) Solo Scene from the 20<sup>th</sup>/21<sup>st</sup> Century performed at the Local Festival.\*
   One (1) Solo Scene from the 19<sup>th</sup> Century and earlier, OR Shakespeare performed at the Local Festival.\*
- 3. One (1) Lyric Poetry Solo as recommended from the Local Festival.
- One (1) Narrative Dramatic or excerpt from Prose Reading as recommended from the Local Festival.
- One (1) short Mime (up to 5 minutes) performed at the Local Festival an outline providing the theme must be provided to the adjudicator.

Please contact your Local Festival for details **before** entering any Alberta Excellence Class.

### ALBERTA EXCELLENCE MUSICAL THEATRE SOLO, Any Voice

#### ALL SELECTIONS MUST BE MEMORIZED AT ALL LEVELS (LOCAL & PROVINCIAL)

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial Level of competition must perform the selection(s) on which they were recommended by at the adjudicator at the Local Level. The recommended selections must include a Ballad and Up-Tempo work.

The term "Up-Tempo" is used to describe music with a lively tempo, often comedy, e.g. - "One Hundred Easy Ways" (from Wonderful Town). The term "Ballad" is used to describe music with a slower tempo, often of a serious or introspective nature, e.g. - "On My Own" (from Les Misérables).

All selections are to be sung from a published score, in any published key of a staged musical. Competitors may use: costumes, one (1) hand prop per selection and up to three (3) of the provided stage props: a table, chair, rehearsal block, and hat rack. No other stage props are allowed. The piano and/or accompanist cannot be used as a prop. Spoken passages are allowed only if published in the script/score provided. The original copy can be the Broadway score, from an Anthology, or purchased online. Proof of purchase must be shown for all online purchases.

Selections are not to include operetta/light opera (e.g. Romberg, Johann Strauss, Lehár, Gilbert & Sullivan, and Offenbach).

#### Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 30 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:

- 1. Enter Class 97000 and perform the following repertoire:
  - One (1) Musical Theatre Ballad
  - One (1) Musical Theatre Up-Tempo
  - One (1) Own choice

#### Provincial Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 30 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform three (3) selections as recommended from the Local Festival consisting of:

- 1. One (1) Musical Theatre Ballad
- One (1) Musical Theatre Up-Tempo
   One (1) Own choice

<sup>\*</sup>One Solo Scene MUST have been performed in Class 80000 at the recommending Local Festival.

#### ALBERTA EXCELLENCE CHORAL – COMMUNITY

#### <u>Local Festival – Community Choirs</u>

Only those Community choirs interested in competing at the Alberta Excellence level should enter classes 90000-90090. All Alberta Excellence choirs who are recommended to the Provincial Festival classes will be recorded and submitted in MP3 format – travel to the Provincial Festival in Edmonton is not required.

- Choirs must perform two (2) contrasting own choice selections, as specified in the classes listed below.
- Only **ONE (1)** original complete copy of each music score is to be submitted (please note: any downloaded music MUST include the front cover of the music no reference to the name of the choir, its conductor, or the festival from which it was recommended should be on the MP3, or the front cover of music submitted electronically.
- Memorization is not mandatory.
- Brief solo passages are allowed only in one of the selections and those passages must not exceed 10% of the length of the selections. Choreography is not allowed in choral classes.

#### **90000 - 19 YEARS AND OVER** - 13 or more singers

- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

#### 90010 - MALE - 13 or more singers, no age restriction

- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- · Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

#### 90020 - 19 YEARS AND UNDER - 13 or more singers

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

# <u>90040 - ENSEMBLE</u> - 6-12 singers, no age restriction (only one [1] ensemble [Community OR School] from each Local Festival is allowed)

• Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts and one (1) of which must be a madrigal (may be a contemporary madrigal).

#### **90050 – 16 YEARS AND UNDER** – 13 or more singers

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

#### 90070 - 12 YEARS AND UNDER - 13 or more singers

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one selection must be sung in two (2) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

#### **90090 - 25 YEARS AND UNDER** - 13 or more singers

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

#### Provincial Festival

Adjudicators at the Provincial Festival may choose, in each category submitted, one choir that is felt to be of an Alberta Excellence standard.

The recommended Choir will have submitted an original complete copy of each score (including the front cover) when they entered the Local Festival. No reference to the name of the choir, its conductor, or the festival from which it was recommended should be on submitted the MP3 or music score.

#### ALBERTA EXCELLENCE CHORAL – SCHOOL

#### Local Festival - School Choirs

Only those School choirs interested in competing at the Alberta Excellence level should enter classes 90000-90090.

All Alberta Excellence choirs who are recommended to the Provincial Festival classes will be recorded and submitted in MP3 format – travel to the Provincial Festival in Edmonton is not required.

- Choirs must perform two contrasting own choice selections, as specified in the classes listed below.
- Only ONE (1) original complete copy of each music score is to be submitted (please note: any downloaded music MUST include the front cover of the music no reference to the name of the choir, its conductor, or the festival from which it was recommended should be on the MP3, or the front cover of music submitted electronically.
- Memorization is not mandatory.
- Brief solo passages are allowed only in one of the selections and those passages must not exceed 10% of the length of the selections. Choreography is not allowed in choral classes.

#### **90010 - MALE CHOIR** - no age restriction - 13 or more singers

- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

#### 90030 - 19 YEARS AND UNDER - 13 or more singers from a single school

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

# **90040 - ENSEMBLE** - no age restriction - 6-12 singers (only one [1] ensemble [Community OR School] from each Local Festival is allowed)

• Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts and one (1) of which must be a madrigal (may be a contemporary madrigal).

#### 90060 - 16 YEARS AND UNDER - 13 or more singers from a single school

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one selection must be sung in two (2) or more parts.
- · Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

#### 90080 - 12 YEARS AND UNDER - 13 or more singers from a single school

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one selection must be sung in two (2) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

#### Provincial Festival

Adjudicators at the Provincial Festival may choose, in each category submitted, one choir that is felt to be of an Alberta Excellence standard.

The recommended Choir will have submitted an original complete copy of each score (including the front cover)
when they entered the Local Festival. No reference to the name of the choir, its conductor, or the festival from
which it was recommended should be on submitted the MP3 or music score.
