# Rules Governing the Local Festivals

A Local Festival may publish an Addendum to accompany the Provincial Syllabus. The Local Addendum includes information that applies particularly to the Local Festival organization. Please check your Local Addendum for changes or modifications to classes, rules, or regulations.

**\*\*NEW IN 2020\*\*** The Festival movement is for acoustic performances only (no electronic amplification), unless indicated in the score (i.e.: singing with a recording of whale song, electric string quartet, etc.). It shall be the responsibility of the competitor to supply all required materials for the performance.

See *Rules Governing the Provincial Festival (Rule 170)* for Local Addendum classes that **may** be eligible for Provincial recommendation.

A Local Festival may establish additional rules that shall apply only to that festival. Except for classes otherwise designated, selections of music are expected to be of a serious "CLASSICAL" nature. See *the Glossary (Appendix I)*

It is the responsibility of every competitor to be familiar with the *Rules Governing Local Festivals*, the *Rules Governing the Provincial Festival*, meanings of the terms in the *Glossary (Appendix I)*, and any rules or regulations established by the Local Festival in its Local Addendum.

A competitor who is interested in eligibility requirements for the Alberta Excellence Classes should consult their Local Festival contact person, or the Provincial Administrator of AMFA.

**Local Festivals reserve the right to refuse any entry.**

## MANAGEMENT

1. Each Local Festival is managed by a committee. Questions concerning a Local Festival should be directed to the local contact person. Decisions of the committee are final.
2. Each Local Festival reserves the right to delete classes or to add classes upon request.
3. Adjudicators' decisions regarding performance are final.
4. At no time may a teacher or competitor engage the adjudicator in conversation prior to or during any performance for that adjudicator. Such an approach may result in the competitor's disqualification.
5. A protest can be considered only if it is made in accordance with regulations established by the Local Festival.
6. **\*\*NEW IN 2020\*\*** No Local Festival, or committee thereof, can change either the marks given by an adjudicator to a competitor nor can they change the adjudicator's recommended entrants to the Provincial Festival. If it is discovered that this has happened, the competitor not recommended by the adjudicator will be disqualified, and a \$500 fine will be levied on the offending Local Festival per offence.

## COMPETITORS

7. The age of a competitor is established as of December 31 preceding the Festival.

8. The Festival movement is intended for "amateurs". See *the Glossary (Appendix I)*
9. Competitors shall enter the festival and all Festival classes based upon their gender identification. Sung and spoken selections are not constrained to gender specificity.
10. A competitor may enter only *once* in a Group of Classes. A Group of Classes consists of those classes listed beside each entry on the Local Festival Classes pages.

**EXCEPTION:** Competitors may enter more than once in a Group of classes if they are playing a different instrument.

11. A member of a duet or ensemble may enter more than once in a class provided that he or she performs a different part, plays a different instrument, or is the conductor.
12. A competitor taking private vocal/musical theatre lessons may not enter School Vocal/Musical Theatre Classes.

## SELECTIONS AND PERFORMANCE

13. In classes using Grades/Levels, any recognized Syllabus **MUST** be used for choosing the selections, and the Syllabus provided by the competitor when requested.
14. Festivals may use any grading system. Suggested grading system:

**\*\*NEW IN 2020\*\*** Adjudicators reserve the right not to award a First Place Certificate in any class.

Definition of a **Selection** as per the **Glossary**:

- A stand-alone piece of music.
- One, and only one, portion of a song cycle (**NOTE:** exception allowed in Alberta Excellence Vocal class)
- One, and only one, piece from a collection of pieces, or as prescribed as a requirement in either the Royal Conservatory of Music, Conservatory Canada, or other recognized syllabus.
- One or more movements of a multi-movement composition: e.g.: sonata, concerto, or concerted work.
- Piano Plan I – 1 (one) or more movement(s) of a Multi-movement Piano Selection may be used as **ONE (1)** selection as long as they keep within the allotted time limit.
- Piano Plan II – 1 (one) or more movement(s) of a Multi-movement Piano Selection may be used as **ONE (1)** selection, but **MUST** keep to the grade/level standards as put forth by any of the recognized Conservatory Syllabi, and be within the allotted time limit.

15. A Local Festival is not permitted to replace any selection listed in the Syllabus without the approval of the Provincial Administrator or Syllabus Coordinator.

16. Names of publishers are included for guidance only. Any standard edition of a selection may be used.
17. A solo **OR** group competitor may not perform the same selection in the same Festival in the following **two (2)** festival years.

**EXCEPTION:**

In String, Woodwind, Brass, Percussion, and Piano Concerto Classes, the 1<sup>st</sup> movement may be repeated in the second and third years provided that in the second year, it is augmented by the 2<sup>nd</sup> movement, and in the third year, all three movements are performed.

18. A solo **OR** group competitor may perform a selection only **once** using the same instrument during a given festival.
19. In classes with "own choice" selections, the total performance must not exceed 20 minutes unless otherwise stated. *See preamble before classes for details.*

**EXCEPTIONS:**

Complete Concerto Classes for Strings, Woodwind, Brass, Percussion, and Piano  
Alberta Excellence Classes

20. One (1) complete **licensed** score, **including solo and accompaniment music**, not a copy, except as provided by Rule 20, must be on site in the performance space. Works classified as "Public Domain" by the **Copyright Act (R.S.C., 1985, c. C-42)** are acceptable as copies. **It is the participants' responsibility to ensure and provide proof of their claim to the selection's public domain classification.** The first bar of each line in music scores must be numbered. Each selection should be clearly marked with the class and competitor name/number.
21. Selections:
- A. Music
1. In every class other than Music Composition, a copy may be used **ONLY** if the holder of the copyright's written approval has been given.
  2. In every Music Composition class, a copy or computer printout must be provided for the adjudicator.
- B. Speech
1. A **licensed** edition must be available for the adjudicator. Works classified as "Public Domain" by the Copyright Act (R.S.C., 1985, c. C-42) are acceptable as copies. It is the participants' responsibility to ensure and provide proof of their claim to the selection's public domain classification.
22. Each Local Festival reserves the right to disqualify a competitor who is not ready to perform when called.
23. Each Local Festival sets its own regulations regarding memorization.
24. Accompaniments must be played as written.

**EXCEPTIONS:** Folk Songs, Musical Theatre, and Pop.

25. Each Local Festival sets its own regulations regarding recorded accompaniments.
26. No person on- or off-stage may augment or coach a performance.
27. Any transposition is permitted except in the following classes:  
Vocal Solo – Bach Aria  
Vocal Solo – Opera  
Vocal Solo – Oratorio  
Competitors must mark each selection advising the adjudicator the key in which the music will be performed.
28. The Canadian Copyright Act, the Privacy Act, and the Criminal Code of Canada dictate the use of recording devices at Local Festivals. Anyone wishing to record performances or **Adjudications** of performers is advised to consult these documents for advice. It is in the safety of the performer that all flash or lighted recording be prohibited. (*See Appendix V*)

**CHORAL, BAND, AND ORCHESTRA CLASSES**

29. Every choir member must be a *bona fide* member. **TEN percent (10%)** of the choir membership may exceed a specified age limit by no more than two years.  
**Note:** Professional vocalists and teachers of singing may sing in a choir of which they are *bona fide* members.
30. A choir must consist of at least 13 members. Choirs with fewer members should notify the Local Festival contact person or the Provincial Administrator of AMFA.
31. When a school entry contains combined grades, the grade having the largest number of students determines the class to be entered.
32. A choir, band, or orchestra entry with members from two or more schools, and trained as a unit, may compete as a school entry only if the members have not been selected on the basis of performing ability. Otherwise, it must compete as a non-school (community) choir, a community band, or community orchestra.

# MUSIC COMPOSITION

## PLEASE NOTE:

You must enter **ONE** class only, and submit only **ONE** composition.

## THE COMPOSITION

The composition will be adjudicated on the basis of originality of ideas, inventiveness, and the ability to express these ideas in a cohesive musical form.

A quality performance is expected, but it is the composition that will be adjudicated.

A copy or a computer printout of your manuscript must be submitted. **DO NOT SUBMIT THE ORIGINAL MANUSCRIPT.**

A brief description of the work **MUST** be included.

A **Solo** or **Duet** performance of a composition **MAY** be performed **live** or on **CD**.

Due to space restrictions, compositions having **3 (three) or more performers**, or those requiring **2 (two) pianos**, **MUST** be performed by **CD**.

If performing by **CD**, the competitor **MUST** bring his or her own equipment.

# The Provincial Festivals

Competitors must be recommended by the adjudicator to proceed from the Local Level to the Provincial Festival. The Local Festival will complete the Provincial Entry Form.

The Alberta Music Festival Association will host an Audio Recorded Choral Festival for **Class 971** (School Choral Grades 1-3), **Class 911** (Choral 12 and Under), **Class 916** (Choral Senior), and **all Alberta Excellence** classes during the live Choral Festival being held from:

**Thursday, May 28 – Saturday, May 30, 2020**

The Solo, Chamber, and Choral Speech Festival will be held from:

**Sunday, May 24 – Saturday, May 30, 2020**

## Rules Governing the Provincial Festival

Competitors, teachers, directors, and parents are responsible for obtaining copies of all pertinent Local Addenda as well as the Provincial Syllabus, and for familiarizing themselves with rules, regulations, and requirements.

### ADMINISTRATION / GENERAL

<b>Protests</b>	100	The Provincial Festival is under the working management of the Provincial Administrator. Any protest, <b>accompanied by a \$50 fee</b> , must be brought immediately to the Provincial Administrator who will refer it to the Rule Interpretation/Appeal Committee.
<b>Class Cancellation</b>	100A	The Executive reserves the right to cancel any class.
<b>Order of competitor performance</b>	100B	The order of performance is determined by the Executive, and only the Executive may alter this order.
<b>Disqualification – use of venue</b>	100C	The Executive reserves the right to disqualify any competitor who uses, or whose accompanist uses, a venue/performance hall for warm-up or rehearsal.
<b>Disqualification – competitor not ready</b>	100D	The Executive reserves the right to disqualify a competitor who is not ready to perform when called.
<b>Acceptance of entries</b>	101A	AMFA reserves the right to refuse any entry.
<b>**NEW IN 2020** Late Entries</b>	101B	If participant Festival entries are not received by AMFA on or before the deadline set by the Executive Committee, a <b>Late Fee of \$20 per late entry will be levied against the Local Festival</b> . Extenuating circumstances will be considered.
<b>**NEW IN 2020** Number of competitors each festival may enter</b>	102	Each member Festival is allowed to enter <b>ONE (1)</b> competitor in each class, and each competitor must have been recommended by an adjudicator. If a competitor is unable to perform, a designated alternate, recommended by the adjudicator, will be allowed to perform. <b>EXCEPTIONS:</b> 1) Local Festivals having over 2,000 entries may recommend two (2) candidates in Piano Classes 701, 702, 703, 709, and 710. 2) Local Festivals will be allowed to send two (2) candidates in Percussion Classes 601 and 602. 3) Local Festivals may send one (1) upper (violin or viola) AND one (1) lower (cello or double bass) candidate in Class 320 – String & Keyboard Sonata – 1 Movement.
<b>Talking to the adjudicator</b>	103	At no time may a teacher, parent, or competitor engage the adjudicator in conversation prior to or during any class. Such an approach may result in the competitor's disqualification. <b>Conversations after a session or class must be confined to social comments, and not any aspect of a performance.</b>
<b>Recording competitions or adjudications</b>	104	The Canadian Copyright Act, the Privacy Act, and the Criminal Code of Canada dictate the use of recording devices at the Provincial Festival. Anyone wishing to record performances or <b>Adjudications</b> of performers is advised to consult these documents for advice. It is in the safety of the performer that all flash or lighted recording be prohibited. (See Appendix V)
<b>**NEW IN 2020** Awarding of Scholarships</b>	105	Adjudicators reserve the right to not award a Scholarship in any class.
<b>Final Decisions</b>	106	Adjudicators' decisions regarding performance are final.



## SOLO COMPETITORS

<b>Who may enter</b>	110	The Festival movement is confined to “amateurs”. (See Glossary – Appendix I)
<b>**NEW IN 2020** Residency</b>	120	The residence or domicile (family home) of a competitor must be within the Province of Alberta or the Northwest Territories, unless the competitor <b>has studied in their discipline with a teacher who resides in Alberta or the Northwest Territories</b> for a minimum of six months during the previous year. <b>This covers lessons via Skype and/or other electronic means.</b>
<b>Age</b>	130	The age of a competitor is established as of December 31 preceding the Festival.
<b>Age Limit</b>	140	The age limit for any solo competitor is 28 years.
<b>Gender Identification</b>	145	Competitors shall enter the Festival and all Festival Classes based upon their gender identification. Sung and spoken selections are not constrained to gender specificity.
<b>**NEW IN 2020** Number of Classes at Local Level</b>	150	A solo competitor must have been adjudicated on at least <b>TWO (2)</b> selections at the Local Festival using the same instrument. <b>Note:</b> The singing voice and the speaking voice are different instruments. <b>EXCEPTIONS:</b> Music Composition – ONE (1) solo class Musical Theatre – ONE (1) solo class <b>Brass, Woodwind, and Percussion – Competitors may compete on two different instruments within the discipline. (i.e.: flute and piccolo, alto and tenor saxophone, trumpet and piccolo trumpet, trumpet and French horn, timpani and a mallet instrument, etc.)</b>
<b>Selections to be Performed</b>	181	A solo competitor may not perform the same selection in the same Festival in the following <b>TWO (2)</b> Festival years. <b>EXCEPTION:</b> 1. Piano Concerto Classes – The 1 <sup>st</sup> movement may be repeated in the second and third years provided that in the second year, it is augmented by the 2 <sup>nd</sup> movement, and in the third year, all three movements are performed.
<b>Number of Recommendations</b>	210	A competitor who has been recommended from one Local Festival must so advise any other Local Festival entered, and must accept only the <b>FIRST</b> recommendation <b>and perform associated repertoire.</b>
<b>**NEW IN 2020** Number of Classes using the Same Instrument</b>	220	A competitor may be recommended to only <b>ONE (1)</b> solo class using the same instrument. <b>Note:</b> The singing voice and the speaking voice are different instruments. <b>EXCEPTIONS:</b> 1. A competitor may be recommended to <b>both</b> Ballad and Up-Tempo Musical Theatre Classes, <b>AND</b> a Vocal Solo Class. 2. Competitors in Piano Concerto Classes 709 & 710 (1 Movement & Complete, respectively) may also be recommended to Classes 701 to 708, and vice versa. 3. A single competitor from each Local Festival may be recommended to <b>both</b> a Solo String Class <b>AND</b> Class 320 – String Solo – String and Keyboard Sonata – 1 Movement. 4. Solo Performer(s) can represent his/her/their Local Festival in <b>both</b> Provincial and Alberta Excellence Classes, if all requirements are met at the Local Level. 5. <b>Brass, Woodwind, and Percussion – Competitors may compete on two different instruments within the discipline. (i.e.: flute and piccolo, alto and tenor saxophone, trumpet and piccolo trumpet, trumpet and French horn, timpani and a mallet instrument, etc.)</b>
<b>Entry Forms &amp; Adjudicator’s Signatures</b>	280	– Every entry for recommended competitors must be submitted to the Provincial Administrator by the member festival on a fully completed Entry Form. – The Entry Form must be sent by the Local Festival within 10 days after the end of the Local Festival, or by the due date set by the Provincial Administrator – whichever is EARLIER. – The signature of the adjudicator making the recommendation must be obtained on the signature sheet provided. Adjudicator’s signature sheets along with the appropriate entry fees are to be forwarded to the Provincial Administrator. – At no time is the form to be given to the competitor, conductor, or teacher

## GROUP COMPETITORS

<b>Who may enter</b>	110	The Festival movement is confined to "amateurs". (See Glossary – Appendix I)
<b>Residency</b>	120	The residence or domicile (family home) of a competitor must be within the Province of Alberta or the Northwest Territories, unless the competitor has studied in their discipline in Alberta or the Northwest Territories for a minimum of six months during the previous year.
<b>Age</b>	130	The age of a competitor is established as of December 31 preceding the Festival.
<b>Number of Selections</b>	160	A group competitor must have performed at least <b>TWO (2)</b> selections in the Local Festival.
<b>Number of Recommendations</b>	210	A competitor who has been recommended from one Local Festival must so advise any other Local Festival entered, and must accept only the <b>FIRST</b> recommendation <b>and perform associated repertoire.</b>
<b>Number of Classes using the Same Instrument</b>	220	A competitor may be recommended to only <b>ONE (1)</b> class using the same instrument. <b>Note:</b> The singing voice and the speaking voice are different instruments. <b>EXCEPTION:</b> 1. Choirs can represent their Local Festival in <b>both</b> Provincial and Alberta Excellence Classes, if all requirements have been met at the Local Level.
<b>Group Competitors</b>	230	A group competitor must be recommended to the class corresponding to the age, grade, or level in which they participated at the Local Festival.
<b>Choir Member Ages</b>	240	Every choir member must be a <i>bona fide</i> member. <b>TEN</b> percent of the choir membership may exceed a specified age limit by no more than two years. <b>Note:</b> Professional vocalists and teachers of singing may sing in a choir of which they are <i>bona fide</i> members.
<b>Choir Grade Ranges</b>	250	When a School Choral or Choral Speech competitor contains a grade range that falls into two Provincial classes, the class entered is based on the grade of the majority number of students.
<b>Choir with members from more than one school</b>	260	A school choir with members from more than one school may compete as a school choir only if members have not been selected on the basis of performing ability. Otherwise, it must compete as a general (community) choir.
<b>Entry Forms &amp; Adjudicator's Signatures</b>	280	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Every entry for recommended competitors must be submitted to the Provincial Administrator by the member festival on a fully completed Entry Form.</li> <li>– The Entry Form must be sent by the Local Festival within 10 days after the end of the Local Festival, or by the due date set by the Provincial Administrator – whichever is EARLIER.</li> <li>– The signature of the adjudicator making the recommendation must be obtained on the signature sheet provided. Adjudicator's signature sheets along with the appropriate entry fees are to be forwarded to the Provincial Administrator.</li> <li>– At no time is the form to be given to the competitor, conductor or teacher</li> </ul>
<b>**NEW IN 2020** Choral Scores and MP3/MP4 files for recorded Choirs &amp; Choral Speech Choirs</b>	282	<b>One (1)</b> licensed copy of each of the music scores and <b>one (1)</b> copy of the MP3 for choirs who are recommended to the Provincial Audio Choral Competition <u>OR</u> if recommended to an Alberta Excellence class – <b>one (1)</b> licenced copy of each score and <b>one (1)</b> MP3 <b>MUST</b> be sent to the Provincial Administrator no later than April 29 <sup>th</sup> . <b>Choral Speech Choirs must submit one (1) licensed copy of each of the speech selections and one (1) copy of the MP4 video recording for choirs who are recommended to the Provincial Recorded Choral Speech Choir Competition.</b>
<b>**NEW IN 2020** Choral classes – solo passages and choreography</b>	410	In Choral classes, brief solo passages are allowed only in one of the selections and those passages must not exceed 10% of the length of the selections. <b>There is to be no movement around the stage, but gestures and simple in-place movements may be used.</b>



## DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY FOR PROVINCIAL CLASSES

<b>What classes are eligible?</b>	170	<p>Only those classes listed in the Provincial Syllabus may be used for eligibility to compete at the Provincial Festival.</p> <p><b>Note:</b> The Syllabus identifies those classes that cannot be used to satisfy eligibility requirements for the Provincial Festival.</p> <p><b>EXCEPTIONS:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. If a class listed in the Syllabus is divided on the basis of age, the subdivided classes may be used to satisfy eligibility requirements.</li> <li>2. ## COPYRIGHT

<b>Authorized Copies</b>	371	In every class, other than Music Composition, a copy may be used <b>ONLY</b> if the holder of the copyright’s written approval has been given.
<b>Music purchased online</b>	372	Music purchased online <b>MUST</b> be accompanied by a receipt or letter indicating that the music is not a copy by virtue of the purchase.
<b>Public Domain</b>	373	Works classified as “Public Domain” by the <b>Copyright Act (R.S.C., 1985, C-42)</b> are acceptable as copies. <b>It is the participants’ responsibility to ensure and provide proof of their claim to the selection’s public domain classification.</b>
